We believe that inasmuch as what we're really dealing with are terms and conditions that would involve the expenditure of Producer funds, that it really ought to be up to the Advisory Committee to negotiate with the Department of Water Resources, and not Chino Basin Board, because they're not going to be the ones that are on the hook for payment for anything that the Board might request for their services.

THE COURT: Let me interject one thing. And I pretty much expended all efforts in writing that -- but I will respond to that, in that the Chino Basin Municipal Water District's employees, to wit., Tracey Stewart and --

Were there five employees in the Watermaster?

MR. DOUGHERTY: I believe so.

THE COURT: They're employees of the Chino Basin

Municipal Water District; and so something might want to 1 2 be accomplished in that regard --MR. DOUGHERTY: Yeah. 3 THE COURT: -- or they're out of work. 4 In that sense, your Honor, what MR. DOUGHERTY: 5 we were suggesting, of course, was that they would be included in the negotiations with the State Board to provide that hopefully they would continue to function under the auspices of the State Board. 9 THE COURT: But there is no quarantee on that. 10 And I can't commit the State Board. 11 MS. MR. MARKMAN: One clean-up item, your Honor. In view of this ruling, there's a pending motion for May 5th as to which opposition has been filed today and will be served on behalf of the Advisory Committee. And my question is, shouldn't that come off calendar in view of this order?

THE COURT: I briefly looked at that. And, in fact, I had the clerk call Mr. Cihigoyenetche's office yesterday to be prepared to give us some figures on how much the Watermaster budget was today, but I saw that, so I didn't need to get that from you, but I did have the clerk call you. I didn't want to talk to you myself. I notice that's in there. At least what they paid last year was for a six-month period. And it was --

Was it 300-and-some-odd-thousand dollars?

MR. CIHIGOYENETCHE: Yeah. What figure are you referring to?

THE COURT: The budget for the Watermaster. I was just wanting to know in case that came up, but apparently, it's not coming up, so I don't need to know.

MR. MARKMAN: We understand that. We understand why the motion was filed; in view of this order whether it needs to wind its way to completion. It's up to Mr. Cihiqoyenetche.

MR. CIHIGOYENETCHE: The question is, is it as to urgency as to those issues? I have no problem, unless there is a compelling reason that some decision on those issues has to be made now or soon. I don't know what time parameters we're looking at as far as referring this out pursuant to the order that we have here today.

THE COURT: Nor do I. Ms. Levin might be able to give us some better insight into that.

MS. LEVIN: Do you mean how quickly we would know about the Department of Water Resources, or --

Yeah, they do. 4505 of the Water --9 THE COURT: They do, but the state legislature 10 MS. LEVIN: 11 has to approve it.
