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

II. BUSINESS ITEMS

A. WATERMASTER 2008-2009 BUDGET

Mr. Manning stated the draft budget presentation was given at all Pool meetings and noted at the Appropriative and Non-Agricultural Pool meeting the members suggested and approved Watermaster staff to change the budget to reflect a reduction of 25% in the 6907 category for legal fees. With that 25% reduction in the budget, in November the budget would be revisited with more refined numbers for the 6907 category. The budget will be updated and reflected in the next Assessment Package. The Agricultural Pool agreed with the Appropriative and Non-Agricultural Pools motion for the 25% reduction in the 6907 category. Mr. Manning noted if this committee agrees with the Pools motions, it will then be taken to the Watermaster Board for approval and be brought back through the Watermaster process in June for final approval. A discussion regarding the budget ensued.

B. CHINO CREEK WELL FIELD COSTS

Mr. Manning stated letters were received from Western Municipal Water District, the City of Ontario, and Jurupa Community Services District regarding their plans to expand desalter production to 40,000 acre-feet while at the same time achieving Hydraulic Control in the southern portion of the basin. Mr. Manning stated Watermaster is requesting direction from the Advisory Committee and the Watermaster Board regarding Watermaster taking the lead position in litigation and in assuming responsibility for costs associated to this task. This item has gone to the Pools and has had unanimous approval. Counsel Fife stated counsel will provide additional information regarding current discussions with the parties and the County at future meetings.

Mr. Manning stated the proposed agreement provides Inland Empire Utilities Agency (IEUA) as the lead agency for the CEQA review associated with the Peace II Agreement and that Watermaster will agree to reimburse IEUA for the costs of this review. The proposed scope of work estimates the costs of analysis at \$63,000. Mr. Manning noted this amount is within the \$200,000 allocated in Watermaster's proposed budget. Mr. Manning stated this item has gone to the Pools and has had unanimous approval. Staff is recommending approval of this agreement.

A. WATERMASTER GENERAL LEGAL COUNSEL REPORT

1. July 24, 2008 Hearing

Counsel Fife stated there was a hearing scheduled in May, however, the court moved that hearing date to July, and has now delayed the hearing a second time to August 21, 2008. Counsel Fife stated a few of the administrative items to be heard at the May hearing were the recent interventions and the Watermaster Thirtieth Annual Report and a very brief hearing might be set prior to the August 21st hearing to move those few items through the court system in a more timely manner.

2. Santa Ana River Permits

Counsel Fife stated on Tuesday the State Board unanimously approved the City of Riverside's Waste Water Change Petition. This was the first of many needed approvals coming out of last May's hearing on the Santa Ana River Permits. Counsel Fife stated he heard that our anticipated permits will be drafted within the next 30 to 60 days. Counsel Fife noted he has received some calls from the State Board staff asking minor details; showing they are in the process of drafting Watermaster's permit. A discussion regarding the original permit ensued.

The governor has submitted a number of items that did not show up in the May revise that were of interest to water agencies. Mr. Manning reviewed several bills relevant to the water industry. Mr. Manning noted the Farm Bill did pass which has some implications for the water industry but, that bill was then vetoed by President. Mr. Manning noted there were enough votes in the senate and house to override the President's veto; more details will follow when additional information is released.

Mr. Manning stated the most recent recharge update is on the back table. Mr. Manning noted 260 acre-feet of mostly recycled water was recharged in April.

OIA Update

Mr. Manning stated at a recent meeting Mr. Treweek advised the group that GeoTrans is working on behalf of the parties involved in the plume and that they were working on drilling four monitoring wells in the Chino Basin in order to provide more information as to their involvement within the Ontario Airport plume. The drilling of those wells has already started and staff will keep the parties apprised as to the progress of those wells and the information the wells provide.

B. ENGINEERING UPDATES

1. Conditions Subsequent 5 and 6 Update

Mr. Wildermuth stated excellent progress has been made on both Conditions Subsequent 5 and 6. Condition Subsequent no. 5 is the preparation of a detailed outline to do a recharge master plan update; this must be filed with the court by July 1, 2008. Subsequent no. 6 is a request directed by the court to have staff go to the Regional Board and get clarification on what is meant by Hydraulic Control. Staff has been working with the Regional Board on this item. A definitive statement will be coming from the Regional Board on Hydraulic Control shortly which will be filed with the court. A discussion regarding Hydraulic Control ensued.

2. Changes in the Characteristics in the Santa Ana River Flow

Mr. Wildermuth reviewed the chart regarding Baseflow changes and the characteristics in the Santa Ana River flow in detail. Mr. Wildermuth reviewed the surface water monitoring locations which included the HCMP surface water sampling sites, USGS gauging stations, and recycled water discharge locations in detail. A discussion regarding Mr. Wildermuth's presentation ensued.

The governor has submitted a number of items that did not show up in the May revise that were of interest to water agencies. Mr. Manning reviewed several bills relevant to the water industry. Mr. Manning noted the Farm Bill did pass which has some implications for the water industry, but that bill was then vetoed by President. Mr. Manning

noted there were enough votes in the senate and house to override the President's veto; more details will follow when additional information is released.

2. Recharge Update

Mr. Manning stated the most recent recharge update is on the back table. Mr. Manning noted 260 acre-feet of mostly recycled water was recharged in April.

3. OIA Update

Mr. Manning stated at a recent meeting Mr. Treweek advised the group that GeoTrans is working on behalf of the parties involved in the plume and that they were working on drilling four monitoring wells in the Chino Basin in order to provide more information as to their involvement within the Ontario Airport plume. The drilling of those wells has already started and staff will keep the parties apprised as to the progress of those wells and the information the wells provide.





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

Background

The Court approved the Peace Agreement, the Implementation Plan and the goals and objectives identified in the OBMP Phase I Report on July 13, 2000, and ordered Watermaster to proceed in a manner consistent with the Peace Agreement. Under the Peace Agreement, Watermaster approval is required for applications to store, recapture, recharge or transfer water, as well as for applications for credits or reimbursements and storage and recovery programs.

Where there is no material physical injury, Watermaster must approve the transaction. Where the request for Watermaster approval is submitted by a party to the Judgment, there is a rebuttable presumption that most of the transactions do not result in Material Physical Injury to a party to the Judgment or the Basin (Storage and Recovery Programs do not have this presumption).

The following application for water transaction is attached with the notice of application.

Notice of Sale or Transfer – Chino Basin Watermaster will purchase 2,862.000 acre-feet of water from the City of Chino. Watermaster will purchase the water at \$258.00 per acre-foot, which is the MWD replenishment rate (not including IEUA and OCWD fees). The transfer will be made first from the City's net under-production in Fiscal Year 2007-08, with any remainder to be recaptured from storage.

Notice of the water transaction identified above was mailed on May 2, 2008 along with the materials submitted by the requestors.

DISCUSSION

Water transactions occur each year and are included as production by the respective entity (if produced) in any relevant analyses conducted by Wildermuth Environmental pursuant to the Peace Agreement and the Rules & Regulations. There is no indication additional analysis regarding this transaction is necessary at this time. As part of the OBMP Implementation Plan, continued measurement of water levels and the installation of extensometers are planned. Based on no real change in the available data, we cannot conclude that the proposed water transaction will cause material physical injury to a party or to the Basin.

Watermaster has a total replenishment obligation (due to overproduction within the Basin) of 13,238.880 AF for Assessment Year 2007-08. Of that total obligation, 9,376.880 AF was pre-purchased from MWD during Fiscal Year 2006-07 due to the expected rate increase. The outstanding obligation is 3,862.000 AF. Due to the fact that MWD does not expect to have replenishment water available this fiscal year and perhaps not next fiscal year either, Watermaster wishes to use the option to purchase water from appropriators to fulfill the replenishment obligation. Watermaster is taking advantage of the City of Chino's offer to sell 2,862.000 AF of water to Watermaster. Watermaster is purchasing the water at \$258.00 per acre-foot, which is the MWD replenishment rate (not including IEUA and OCWD fees). The transfer will be made first from the City's net under-production in Fiscal Year 2007-08, with any remainder to be recaptured from storage. The 85/15 Rule does not apply to this transfer because 85/15 payments and credits were already established in the Assessment Package. Background

The Court approved the Peace Agreement, the Implementation Plan and the goals and objectives identified in the OBMP Phase I Report on July 13, 2000, and ordered Watermaster to proceed in a manner consistent with the Peace Agreement. Under the Peace Agreement, Watermaster approval is required for applications to store, recapture, recharge or transfer water, as well as for applications for credits or reimbursements and storage and recovery programs.

Where there is no material physical injury, Watermaster must approve the transaction. Where the request for Watermaster approval is submitted by a party to the Judgment, there is a rebuttable presumption that most of the transactions do not result in Material Physical Injury to a party to the Judgment or the Basin (Storage and Recovery Programs do not have this presumption).

The following application for the water transaction is attached with the notice of application.

Notice of Sale or Transfer – Chino Basin Watermaster will purchase 1,000.000 acre-feet of water from Santa Ana River Water Company (SARWC). Watermaster will purchase the water at \$258.00 per acre-foot, which is the MWD replenishment rate (not including IEUA and OCWD fees). The transfer will be made from SARWC's net under-production in Fiscal Year 2007-08.

Notice of the water transaction identified above was mailed on May 9, 2008 along with the materials submitted by the requestors.

DISCUSSION

Water transactions occur each year and are included as production by the respective entity (if produced) in any relevant analyses conducted by Wildermuth Environmental pursuant to the Peace Agreement and the Rules & Regulations. There is no indication additional analysis regarding this transaction is necessary at this time. As part of the OBMP Implementation Plan, continued measurement of water levels and the installation of extensometers are planned. Based on no real change in the available data, we cannot conclude that the proposed water transaction will cause material physical injury to a party or to the Basin.

Watermaster has a total replenishment obligation (due to overproduction within the Basin) of 13,238.880 AF for Assessment Year 2007-08. Of that total obligation, 9,376.880 AF was pre-purchased from MWD during Fiscal Year 2006-07 due to the expected rate increase. The outstanding replenishment obligation is 3,862.000 AF. Due to the fact that MWD does not expect to have replenishment water available this fiscal year and perhaps not next fiscal year either, Watermaster wishes to use the option to purchase water from appropriators to fulfill its replenishment obligation. Watermaster is taking advantage of Santa Ana River Water Company's offer to sell 1,000.000 AF of water to Watermaster. The transfer will be made from Santa Ana River Water Company's net under-production in Fiscal Year 2007-08. The 85/15 Rule does not apply to this transfer because 85/15 payments and credits were already established in the Assessment Package. This transfer is functioning in a similar manner as Watermaster purchases from MWD/IEUA.
