## II. BUSINESS ITEM

# A. 2010 Community Outreach Campaign

Mr. Manning stated for the past four years Watermaster has participated in a public information campaign with Inland Empire Utilities Agency (IEUA), who is the lead agency, along with other water agencies. This is a public message about the water infrastructure growth, a conservation message, along with recycled water education to ensure the public is informed as to what the water agencies are doing to assist in these areas. Mr. Manning stated the bond measure will be coming up in 2010 for election and staff feels this campaign is a good one to continue with to make sure the public understands the need for additional infrastructure. Watermaster in working with IEUA and the Los Angeles newspaper group have helped develop another informative campaign. The cost is the exact same as last year; Watermaster's portion is \$10,000. Mr. Manning offered a detailed description of past ads and what the present ads will entail. A discussion regarding this matter ensued.

## III. REPORTS/UPDATES

# A. WATERMASTER GENERAL LEGAL COUNSEL REPORT

1. Chino Airport Water Quality Update

Counsel Fife stated Watermaster staff has been working on two of the plumes in the Chino Basin; Ontario International Airport (OIA) and Chino Airport. There has been a fairly good response from the potential responsible parties (PRPs) on the OIA plume however; there has not been as good a result from the County of San Bernardino regarding the Chino Airport plume. Recently there has been a slightly better response from the county and counsel has had some engagement from the county counsel. A meeting has been scheduled with the county staff and counsel for next week along with the Chino Desalter Authority, the County of San Bernardino, and Watermaster staff will be involved in that meeting. There are high hopes from the parties that some resolve will come about. Counsel Fife stated the main reason for this item to be on the agenda is to inform the parties there might be some insurance involvement on the county side and which might need a lawsuit filed in order to trigger the ball moving forward on an agreement. Counsel Fife stated he will keep all parties apprised as to what is going on in the future regarding this matter.

## 2. DYY Update

Counsel Fife stated in August 2009 the concept of the waiver of losses on the Metropolitan Water District (MWD) DYY account was approved. This was part of a package that was supposed to involve the expansion of the account from 100,000 acre-feet to 150,000 acre-feet; however, there are a lot of issues that still need to be dealt with regarding this. A meeting took place outside the pool meetings after the approval in September 2009 as to what the next steps would be. The first issue to be dealt was an accounting dispute between the Chino Desalter Authority (CDA) and MWD over how to reflect the replenishment costs to the CDA which then went into the calculations of the LRP funding. Since then, the financial staff from different agencies have been talking and attempting to get all involved on the same page to what needs to be taken care of sequentially. After that first issue is resolved the next item on the list will be dealt with.
