DECLARATION OF FRANKLIN YOO

I, Franklin Yoo, declare:

1. I am the Data Services and Judgment Reporting Manager for Chino Basin Watermaster (“Watermaster”). I have been employed by Watermaster since 2005 and am familiar with Watermaster’s historical reporting systems, databases, annual reports, and records relating to groundwater production and storage programs administered within the Chino Basin. If called as a witness, I could and would competently testify to the matters stated herein.

2. I make this declaration in support of Watermaster’s Supplemental Brief in Response to the Court’s Order Requesting Further Briefing. The statements in this declaration are based on my review of Watermaster records maintained in the ordinary course of Watermaster’s operations.

3. The Dry Year Yield (“DYY”) Program is a Watermaster-approved storage and recovery program. Under the DYY Program, Metropolitan Water District of Southern California (“MWD”) stores imported water in a Watermaster-administered DYY storage account (“DYY Storage Account”) in the Chino Basin, and participating parties may later recover water from that account in accordance with the DYY Program agreements and operating procedures.

4. Watermaster’s records distinguish water held in the DYY storage account from native Basin groundwater production. The records maintained for the DYY Program track water placed into storage, water remaining in storage, and water recovered from storage.

5. Watermaster accounts for DYY Program water in the DYY Storage Account. In “put” years, imported Program Water delivered by MWD is credited to that account when stored through direct wet-water recharge, including spreading or injection, or through in-lieu recharge/delivery; credits are made acre-foot-for-acre-foot, less Watermaster-assessed losses. In “call” or recovery years, Watermaster debits the account one acre-foot for each acre-foot produced from the account and identifies the quantities produced by each Operating Party. Watermaster maintains monthly account statements and reflects storage, withdrawals, additions, extractions, and losses in the annual Watermaster accounting.

6. In connection with Watermaster's evaluation of Basin storage capacity and storage-account management during the period relevant to the 2019 Letter Agreement, Watermaster staff

1 prepared a report dated March 26, 2020 entitled “Notice of Potential Storage Limitation.” The
2 report reflects Watermaster's contemporaneous evaluation of potential limitations related to Basin
3 storage capacity. At the Board meeting on March 26, 2020, the Watermaster Board unanimously
4 authorized Watermaster Staff to issue the “Notice of Potential Storage Limitation”.

5 7. Attached as **Exhibit A** is a true and correct copy of the March 26, 2020 Watermaster
6 staff report entitled “Notice of Potential Storage Limitation,” maintained by Watermaster in the
7 ordinary course of business.

8 8. In general, withdrawals from groundwater storage accounts reduce the volume of
9 water remaining in storage. Accordingly, to the extent water is withdrawn from a storage account,
10 the amount of water occupying available storage capacity is reduced.

11 9. Based on my review of Watermaster’s DYY Program accounting records, the water
12 recovered by CVWD and FWC in the fiscal years addressed by the corrected and amended
13 assessment packages was recorded by Watermaster as water recovered from the DYY Storage
14 Account, not as production of native Basin water or Operating Safe Yield.

15 10. In preparation to make this declaration, I was unable to find any instance in the
16 Watermaster’s records where a replenishment charge or obligation of any kind was imposed on the
17 withdrawal of imported water held in a storage account through the DYY Program.

18 11. Watermaster maintains Water Activity Reports certified by each party pumping
19 groundwater for each production year. These reports show groundwater produced, water placed
20 into and taken out of storage accounts, water transactions, among other information.

21 12. In the months immediately following the close of a production year, parties certify
22 their Water Activity Reports as to that production year, and Watermaster utilizes the information
23 in these reports to produce the Assessment Package that is based on activity in that production year.

24 13. Cucamonga Valley Water District’s Water Activity Reports showing the taking of
25 water from the DYY Storage Account in Production Years 2020/21 and 2021/22 are attached as
26 **Exhibit B.**

27 14. Fontana Water Company’s Water Activity Reports showing the taking of water from
28 the DYY Storage Account in Production Years 2020/21 and 2021/22 are attached as **Exhibit C.**

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15. The records referenced in this declaration are maintained by Watermaster in the ordinary course of its operations.

SUBJECT: Notice of Potential Storage Limitation (Business Item II.B.)
SUMMARY:

Issue: The parties' cumulative stored water accounts are approaching the Basin's Safe Storage Capacity, as temporarily increased by the 2017 PEIR addendum, identified in the Optimum Basin Management Program Implementation Plan.

Recommendation: Authorize staff to issue the Notice.

Financial Impact: There is no financial impact associated with this action.

Watermaster's function is to administer and enforce provisions of the Judgment and subsequent orders of the Court, and to develop and implement an Optimum Basin Management Program

BACKGROUND

In 2000, the management of the Chino Basin pursuant to the Optimum Basin Management Program Implementation Plan was the subject of the Final Program Environmental Impact Report for the Optimum Basin Management Program (PEIR). The PEIR analyzed the impacts of storage of water within the Basin within the 500,000 acre-feet Safe Storage Capacity, as defined within the OBMP Implementation Plan.

In 2017, the Inland Empire Utilities Agency ("IEUA") adopted Addendum No. 1 to the Optimum Basin Management Program Project, which found that the Safe Storage Capacity could be expanded to 600,000 acre-feet of managed storage through June 2021 without additional impacts to the Basin ("Temporary Safe Storage Capacity").

The Metropolitan Water District of Southern California ("MWD"), the Inland Empire Utilities Agency, Three Valleys Municipal Water District, and Watermaster have entered into a contract titled Dry Year Yield Program (DYYP). Under the provisions of the contract MWD has the right to put up to 25,000 acre-feet of water per year in the program, up to a maximum of 100,000 acre-feet.

Through June 30, 2019, approximately 549,240 acre-feet of the Temporary Safe Storage Capacity are occupied by water of the Parties and water stored by MWD pursuant to the DYYP. MWD has "put" an additional 17,350 acre-feet in the DYYP since July 1, 2019, bringing the balance of the DYYP to approximately 65,065 acre-feet.

DISCUSSION

Based on the parties' projections of pumping in production year 2019/20, and the remaining contractual obligation to accommodate MWD, Watermaster anticipates the volume occupied by the parties and the DYYP will increase in production 2020/21 and reach approximately 590,000 acre-feet and possibly as high as 595,000 acre-feet.

At present the water in storage is projected to approach the Temporary Safe Storage Capacity of 600,000 acre-feet. Watermaster and the parties need to develop a plan for orderly evacuation of water from storage for amounts that exceed the Temporary Safe Storage Capacity, and Watermaster is asking the parties for input in developing such a plan. Beyond June 30, 2021 the Safe Storage Capacity would revert to 500,000 acre-feet, creating an even greater need to evacuate storage.

On March 26, 2020 Watermaster staff will present the attached Draft Notice (Attachment 1) to the Watermaster Board, with the recommendation to authorize serving the Notice on the parties.

The Watermaster Parties have developed a draft Storage Management Plan, pursuant to which the OBMP Implementation Plan's Safe Storage Capacity concept would be replaced by a First Managed Storage Band comprising 800,000 acre-feet. IEUA has initiated the CEQA review process of this Storage Management Plan such that it would be completed by June 30, 2020. Upon the agreement of the parties to amend the Peace Agreement in order to include the Storage Management Plan within the OBMP Implementation Plan, the Court could order Watermaster to implement the Plan and up to 800,000 acre-feet of storage space would be available for use, providing enough storage capacity to accommodate the parties' storage needs, including DYYP, in the future.

On March 12, 2020 the Draft Notice was presented to the Pools for advice and assistance. The City of Chino's legal counsel commented that the Notice as written is too vague, ill-advised, and an inappropriate warning to the parties that have a right to storage in the Basin. No other advice was offered during the Pool meetings.

On March 19, 2020 the Draft Notice was presented to the Advisory Committee for advice and assistance. Advice was offered by various members of the Advisory Committee: the City of Ontario representative

requested more detail on the “orderly plan for evacuation of storage” mentioned in the Notice, and advised that there might be several options available to the parties; the City of Pomona representative commented that Watermaster staff should commence developing a plan for evacuation of storage sooner rather than later; the City of Chino Hills representative advised that Watermaster staff should coordinate closely with MWD to understand their future plans regarding DYY “put”; and, the Monte Vista Water District representative advised that development of a plan for evacuation of storage should be considered in light the ongoing nationwide emergency response to the corona virus pandemic.

Watermaster staff and counsel have considered the advice offered during the Pool and Advisory Committee meetings and recommend proceeding issuing the notice as drafted.

NOTICE OF POTENTIAL LIMITATION ON LOCAL STORAGE

Pursuant to sections 5.2(b)(x) and 5.2(b)(xi) of the Peace Agreement and sections 8.2(h) and 8.2(i) of the Watermaster Rules & Regulations, the Watermaster Board provides this notice that the total quantity of stored water in the Basin in excess of 600,000 acre-feet (AF) is subject to limitation by Watermaster and the exercise of its discretion.

In accordance with contractual obligations among the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California ("MWD"), the Inland Empire Utilities Agency, Three Valleys Municipal Water District, and Watermaster, MWD may require Watermaster to accept delivery of 25,000 AF per annum to be placed into storage up to a maximum capacity of 100,000 AF. When this stored water is combined with the cumulative quantity of existing and projected managed storage, it may cause the total volume of stored water to exceed 600,000 AF.

Consequently, prior to May 1, 2020, Watermaster will coordinate with parties to the Judgment to develop an orderly plan to facilitate and potentially require the parties removing water from storage by reasonable means in an amount sufficient to enable Watermaster to fulfill its contractual obligations as to recharge and storage of imported water by MWD.
